Key Messages

- A light wintry mix is expected at times this morning and afternoon. Then a band of snow will move through the area this evening.
- **Between a dusting and 1.5 inches of snow** accumulation is expected. Little if any ice accumulation.
- Road impacts should be limited to a few slick spots today.

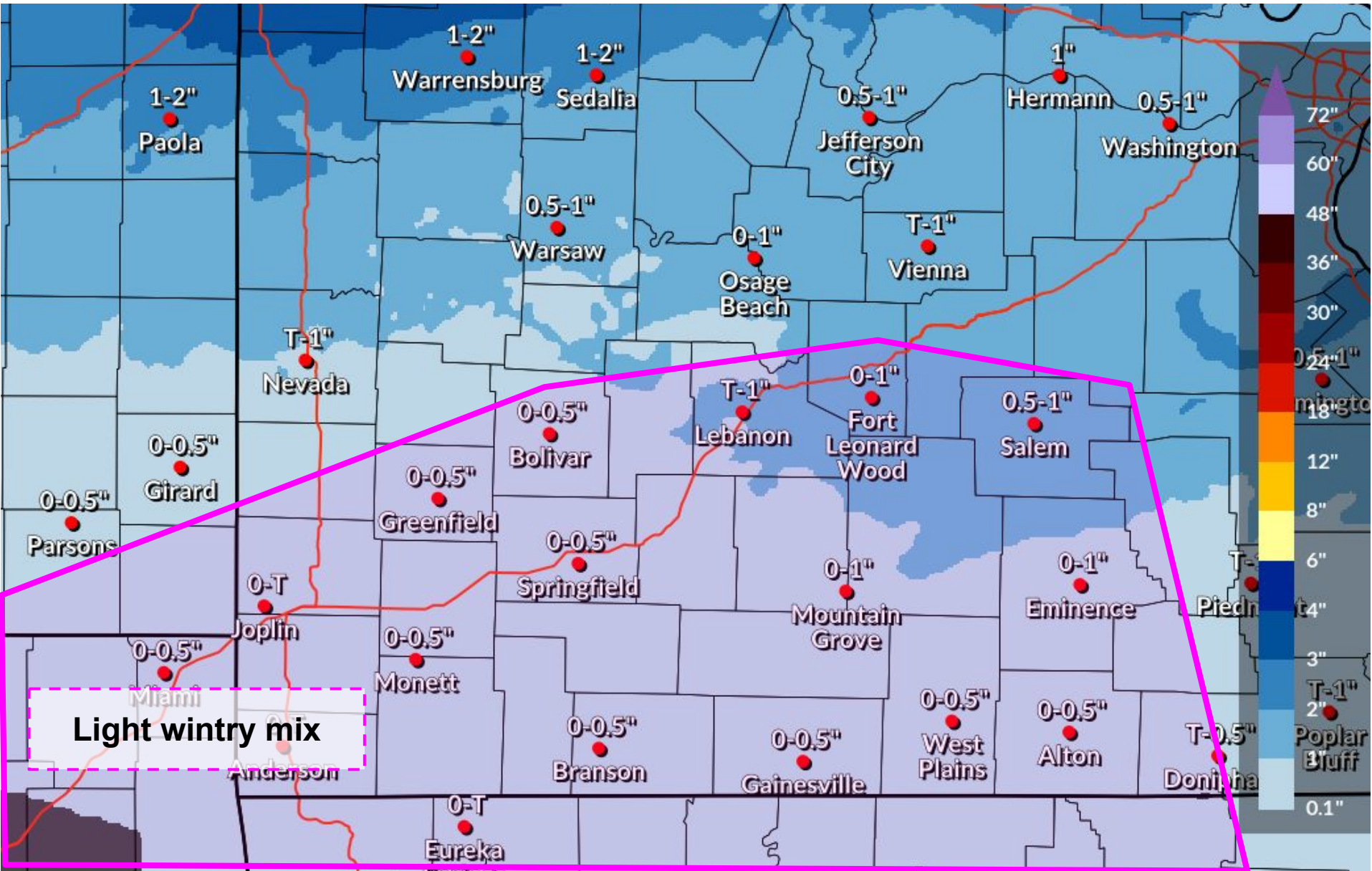

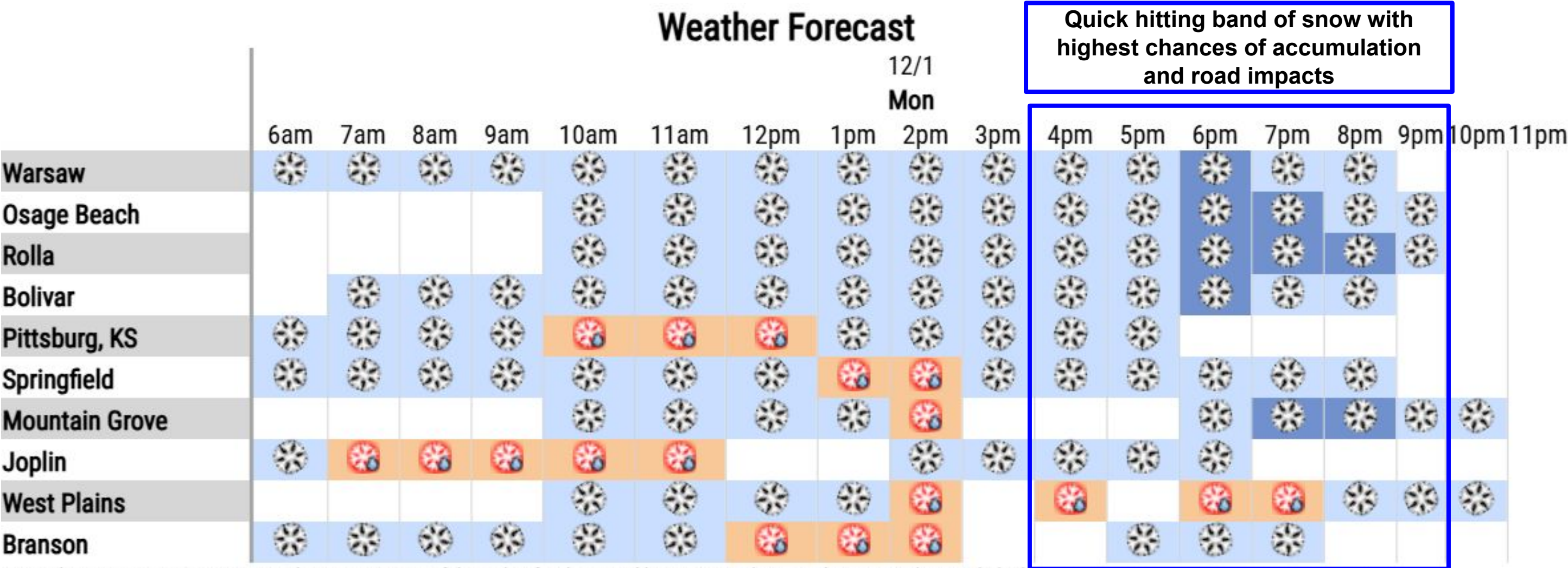

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A wintry mix of sleet and snow this morning with localized travel impacts

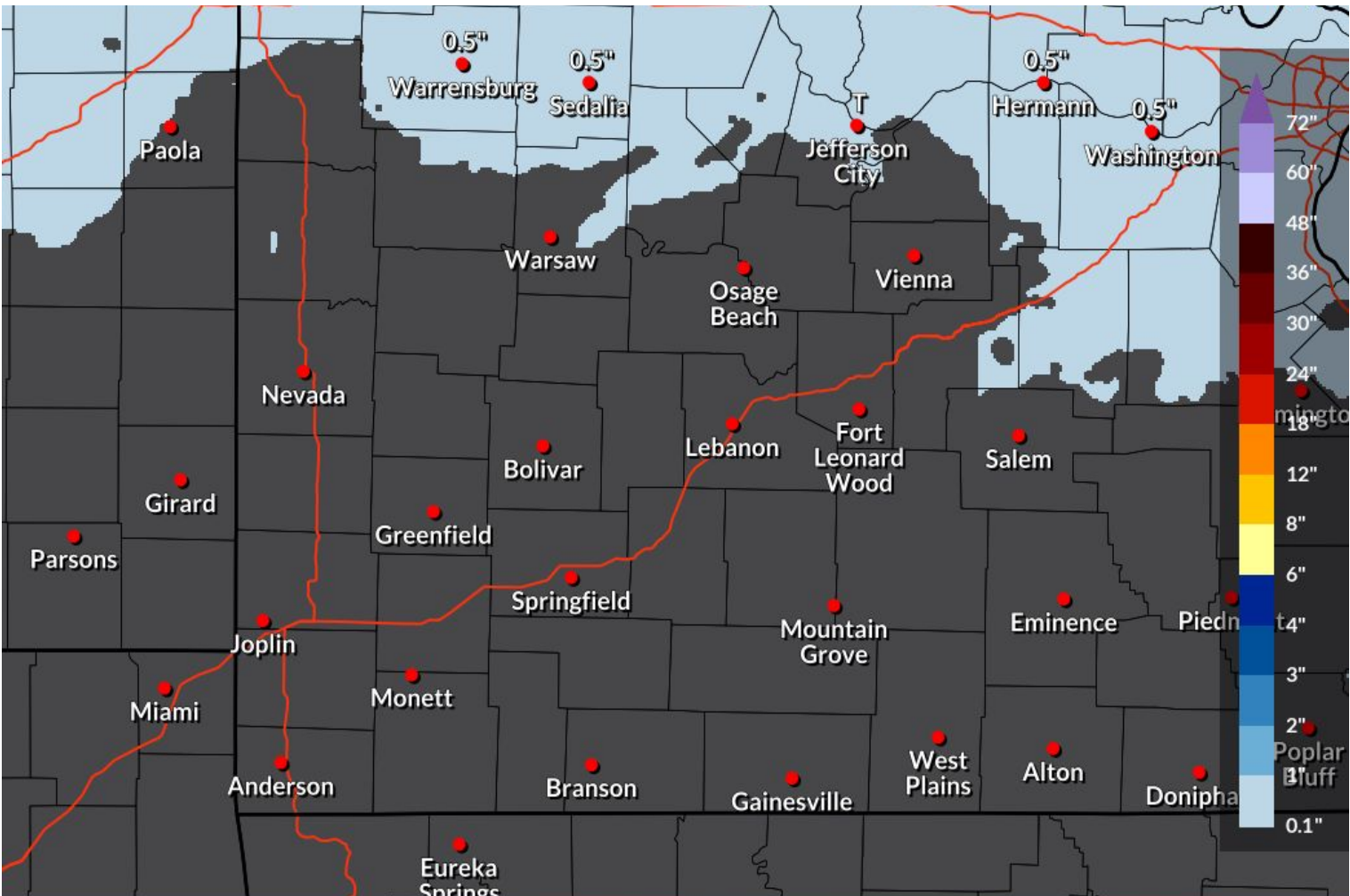

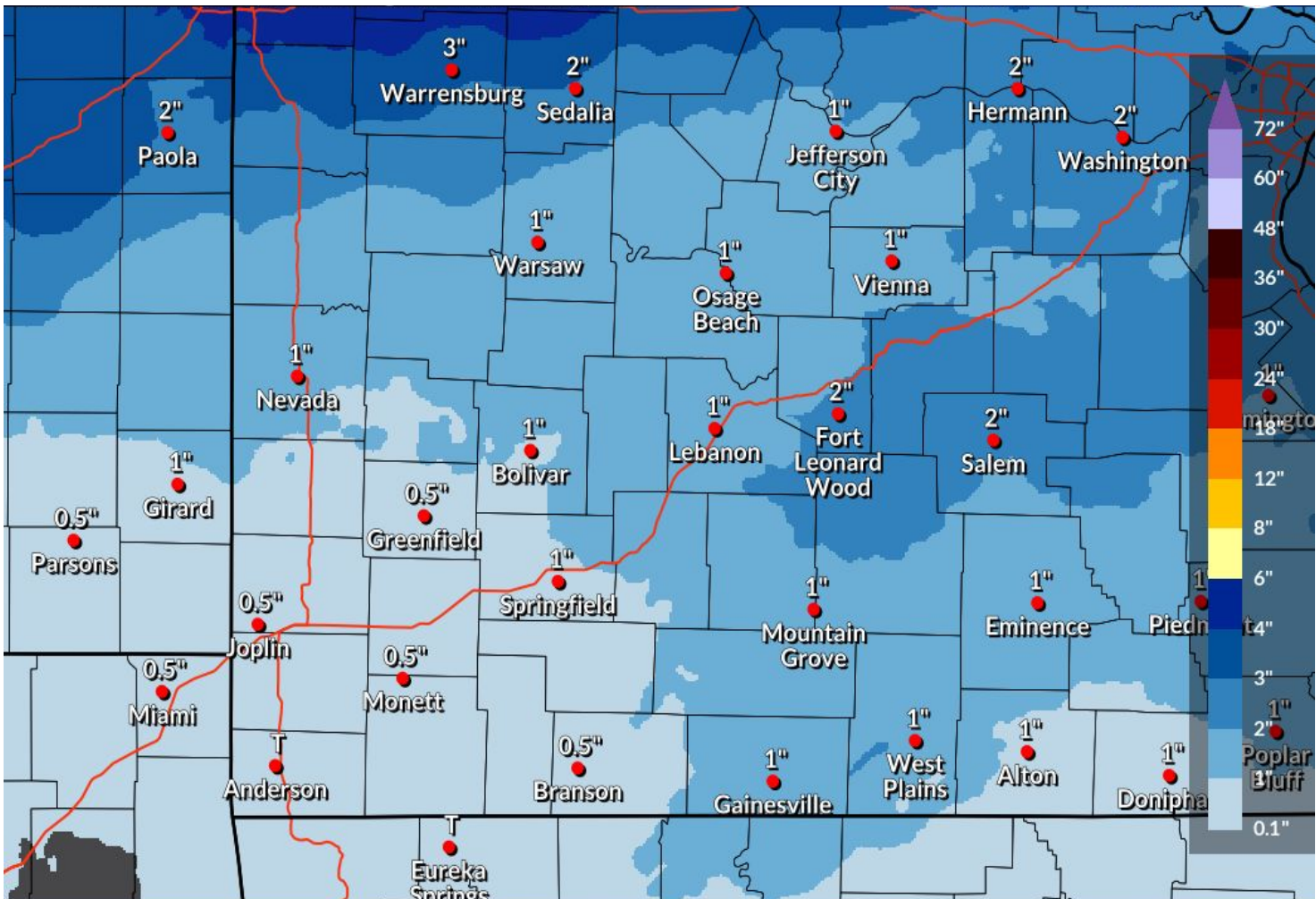


Low End and High End Amounts

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Low End Snowfall Amounts



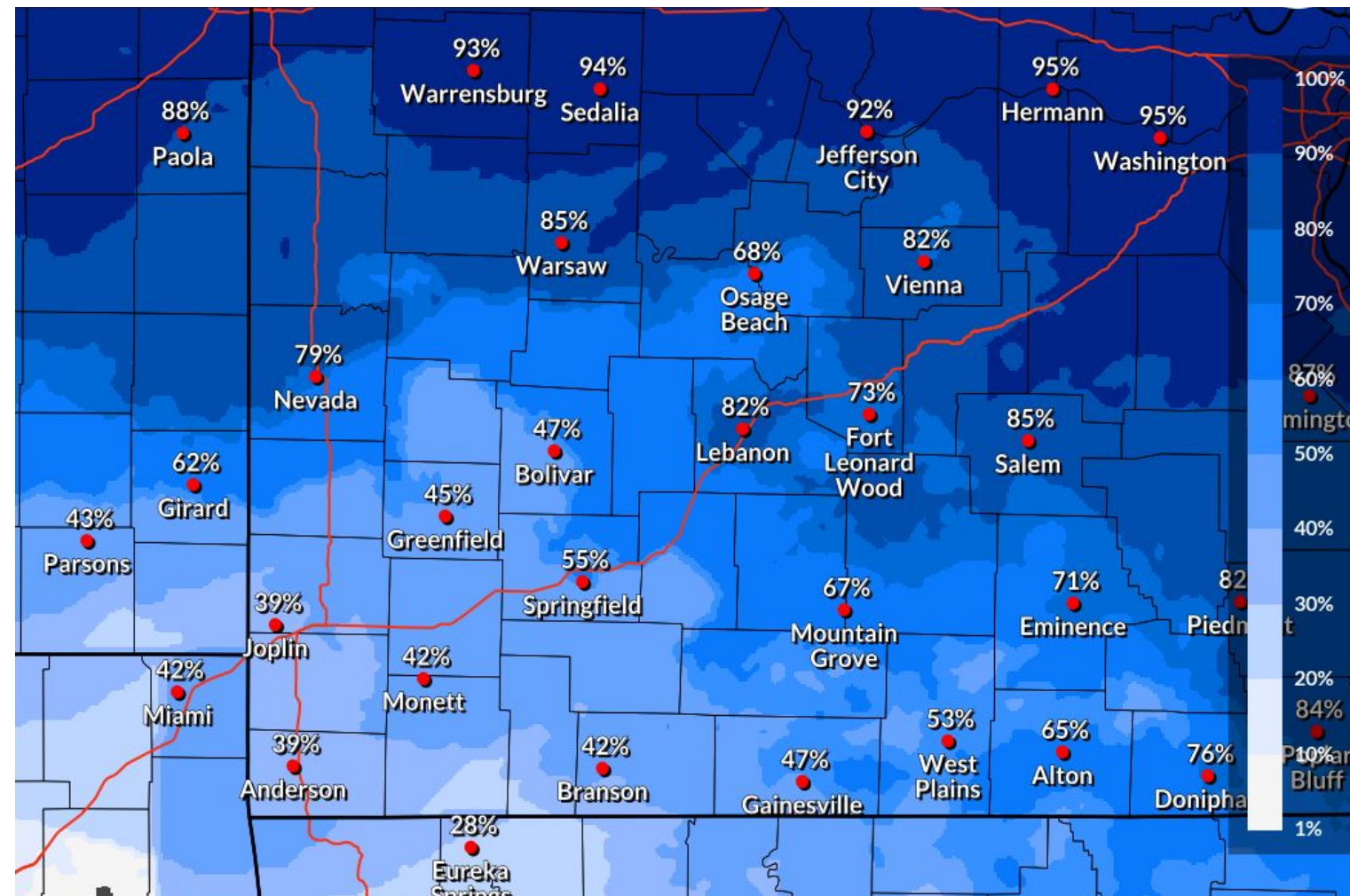
High End Snowfall Amounts



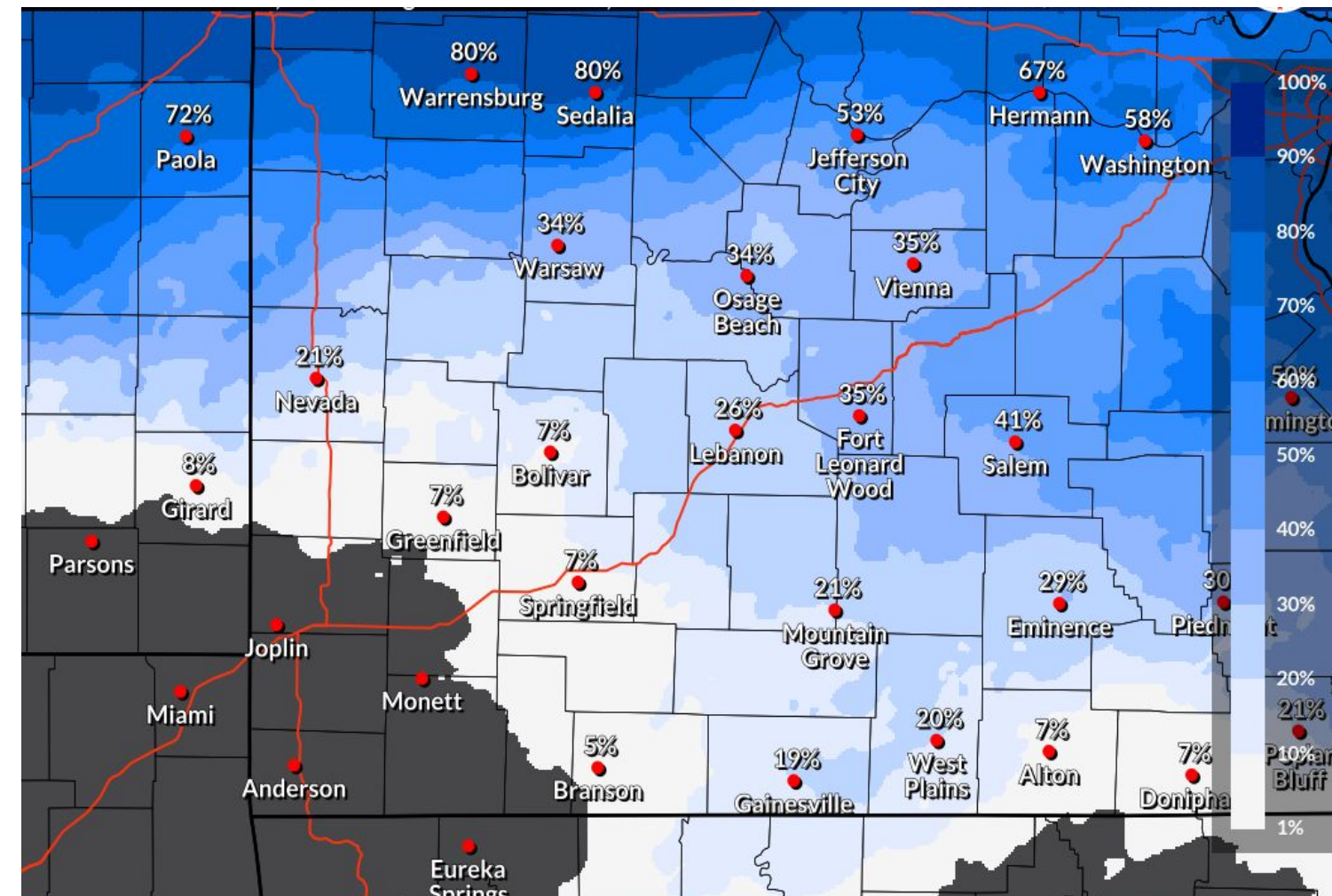


Probabilistic Snowfall

Probability of > 1.0" of snowfall

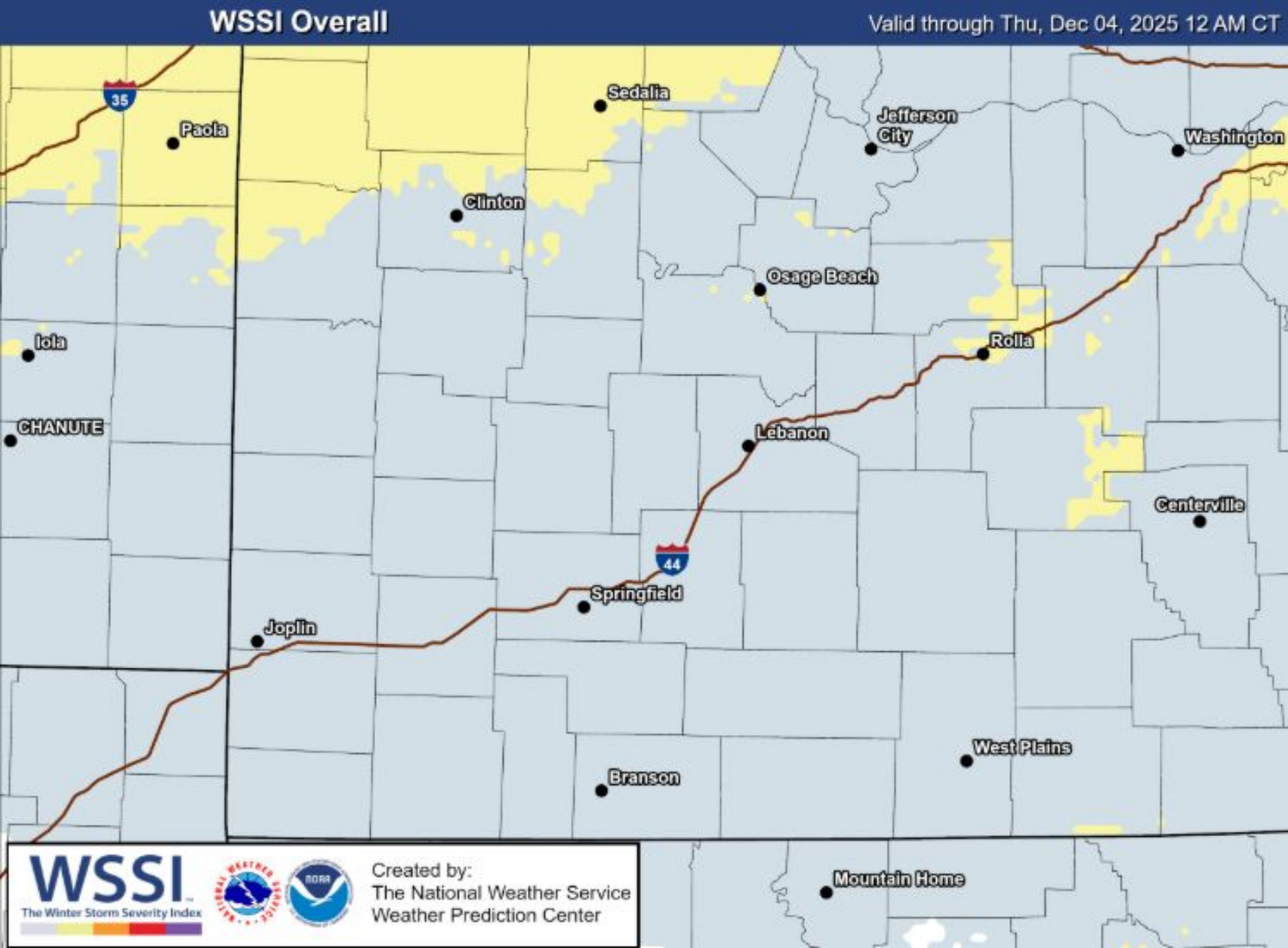




Winter Storm Severity Index

Potential Winter Storm Impacts

Winter Weather Area

- Expect Winter Weather.
- Winter driving conditions. **Drive carefully.**

Minor Impacts

- Expect a few inconveniences to daily life.
- Winter driving conditions. **Use caution while driving.**

Moderate Impacts

- Expect disruptions to daily life.
- Hazardous driving conditions. **Use extra caution while driving.**
 - Closures and disruptions to infrastructure may occur.

Major Impacts

- Expect considerable disruptions to daily life.
- Dangerous or impossible driving conditions. **Avoid travel if possible.**
 - Widespread closures and disruptions to infrastructure may occur.

Extreme Impacts

- Expect substantial disruptions to daily life.
- Extremely dangerous or impossible driving conditions. **Travel is not advised.**
 - Extensive and widespread closures and disruptions to infrastructure may occur.
 - Life-saving actions may be needed.

Confidence Details

- Medium to high confidence that a round of winter mix (mainly sleet/snow) this morning across southern Missouri with a band of snow this evening.
- Subtle details in the temperature of the atmosphere at different heights will determine precipitation type in a given location at a given time.

Alternate Scenarios

- If the morning band of winter mix comes in heavier then it could cause a few more slick spots than expected.
- If the evening snow bands shifts north/south that could decrease/increase amounts for the area.



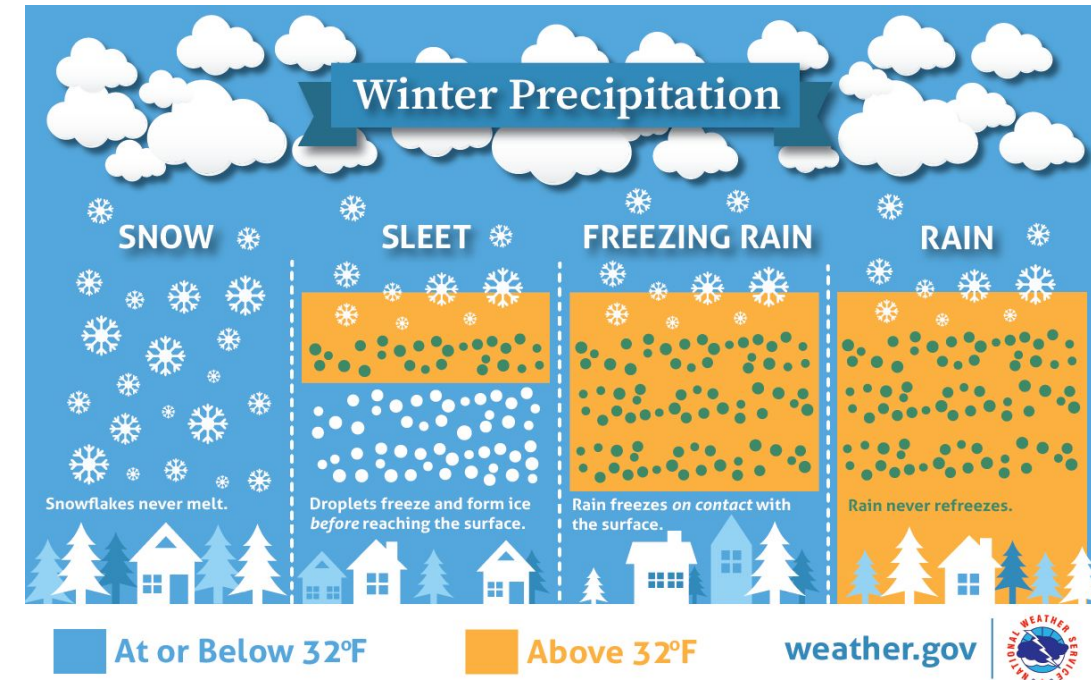
