Key Messages

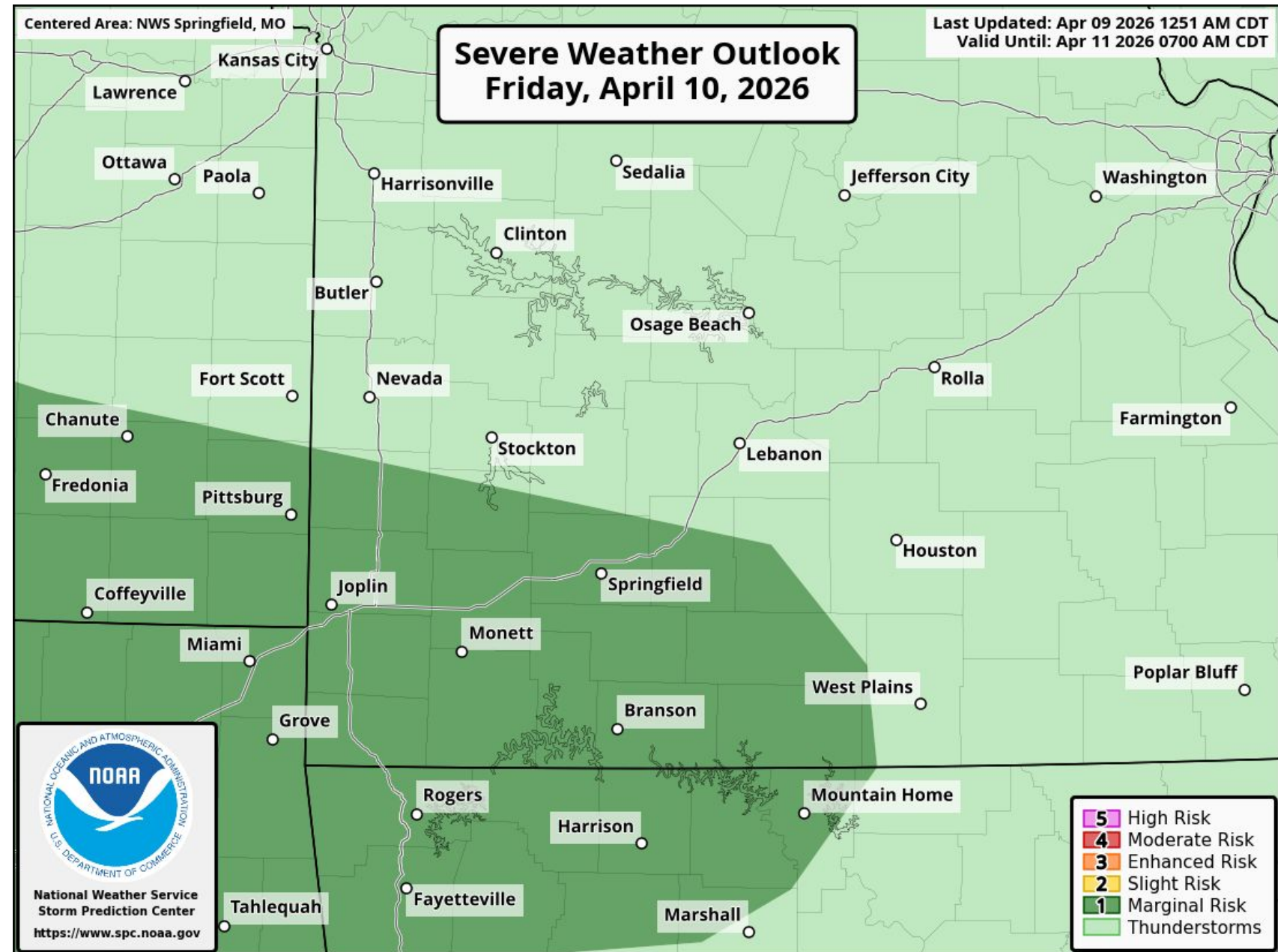
- We will remain in a favorable pattern for multiple rounds of strong to severe thunderstorms late this week and potentially a good part of next week.

Severe Threats



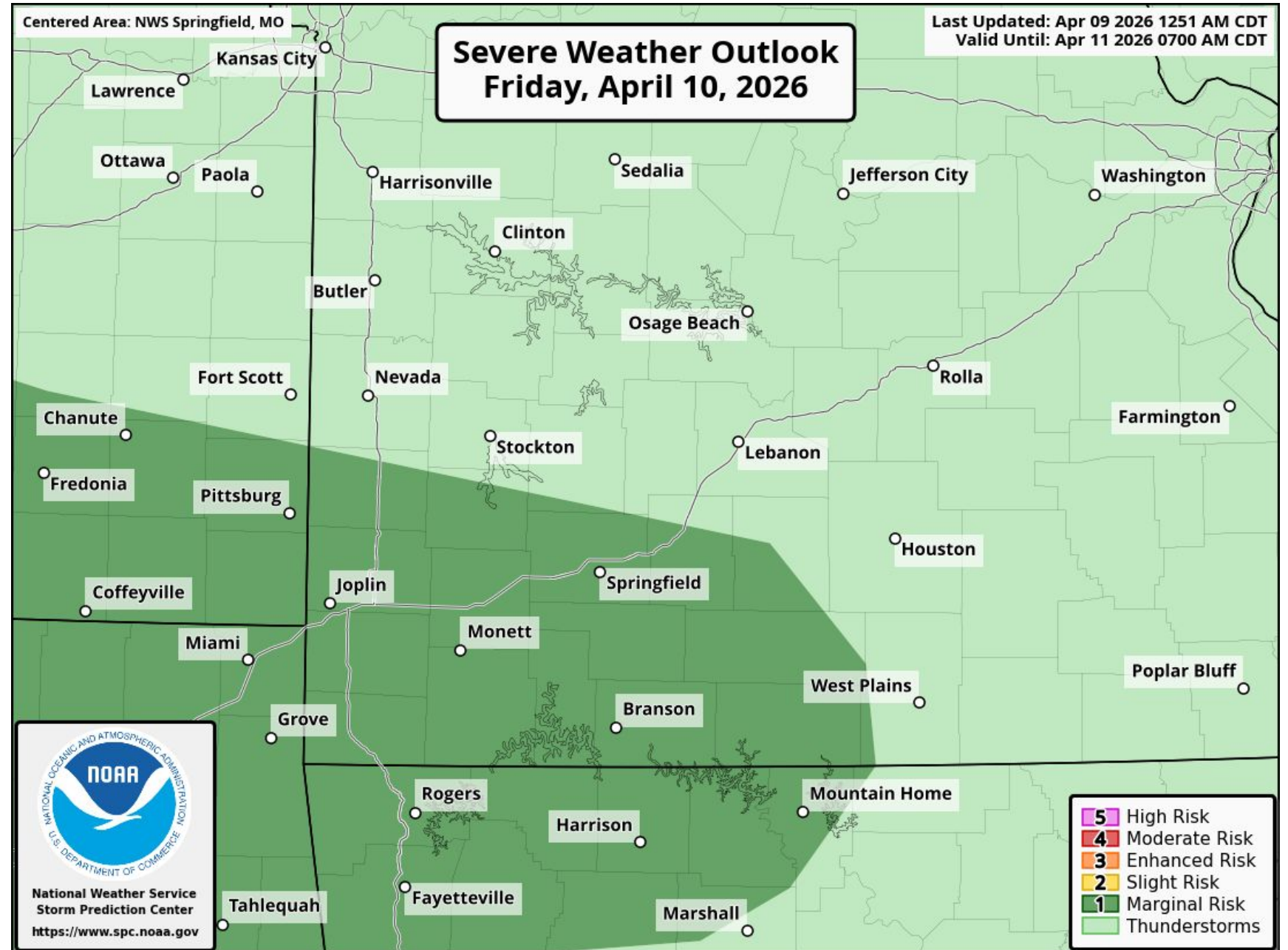
Large Hail

Up to 60 mph winds

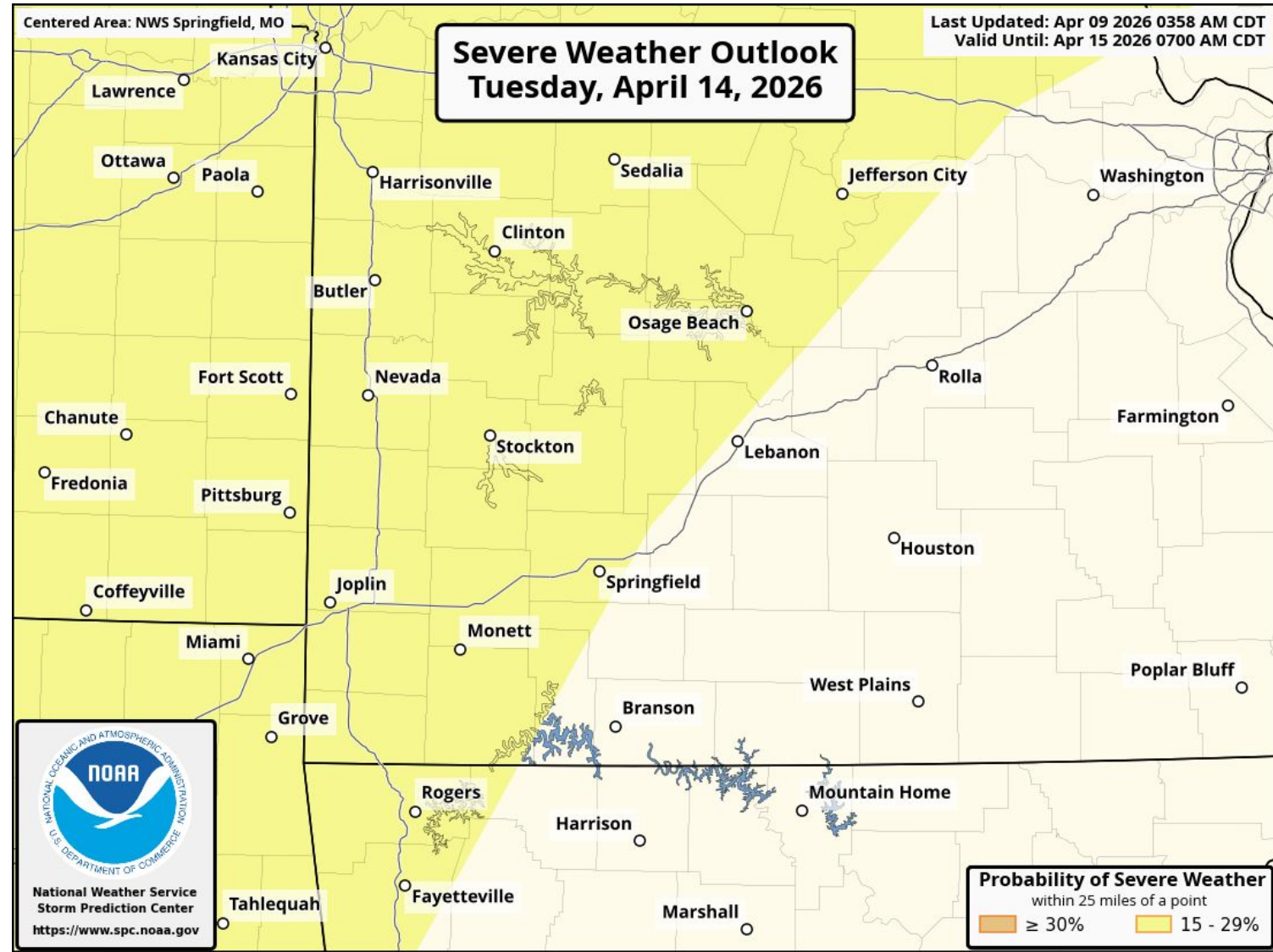
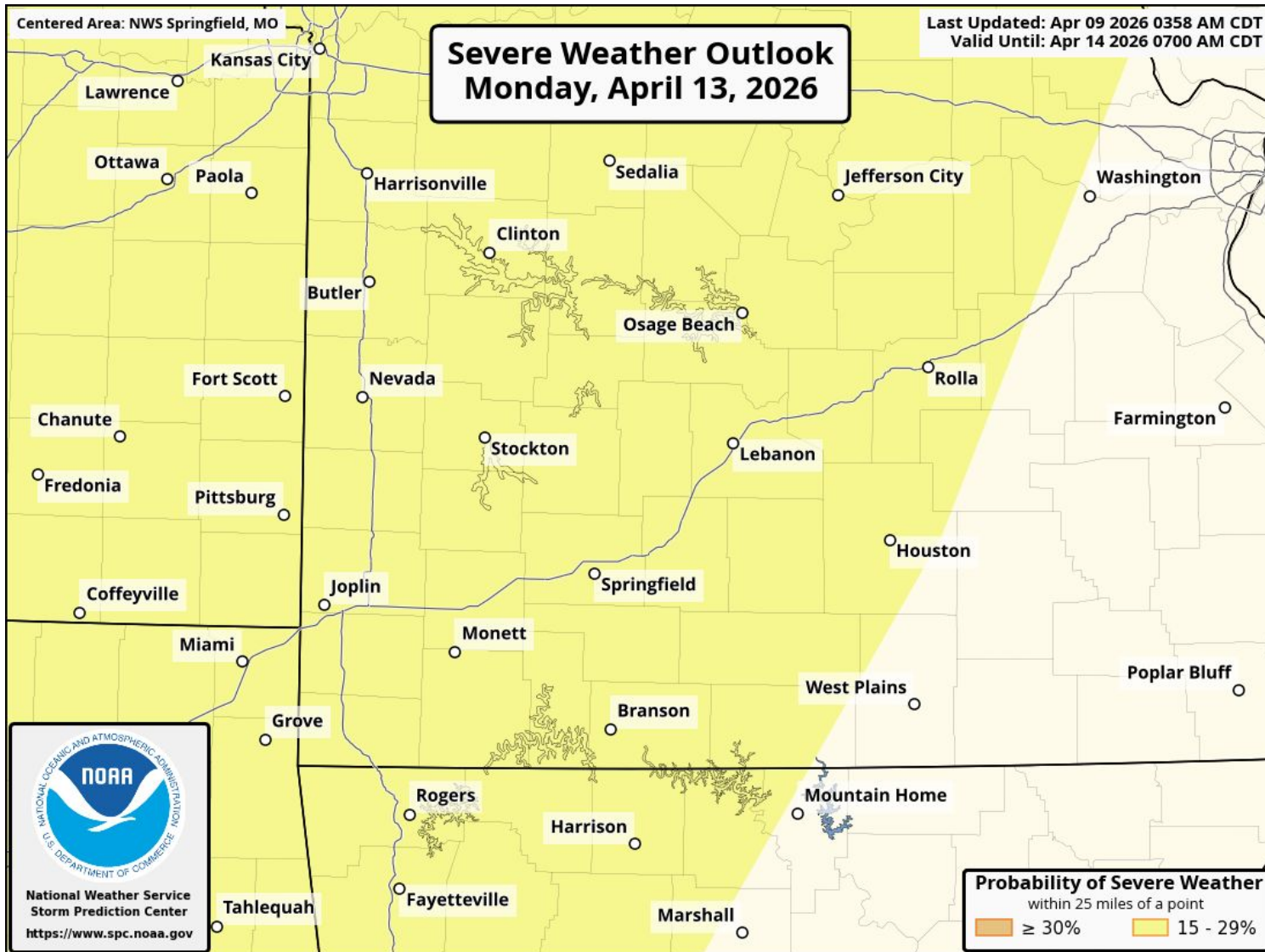
